Welcome to the V Mares da Fin do Mundo International Documentary Film Festival. This is going to be a really special edition, as it coincides in a year marked by important commemorations related to cinema and the sea.

For this reason, we have programmed a special screening with a colloquium format, where the public will be able to establish dialogues with professionals from this sector who closely lived those fateful days.

The festival is signatory of the Sustainable Culture Pact, committed to the 2030 Agenda and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). For this reason, among the additional activities of this edition, we will have a round table in which we will propose an open meeting with a topic of high relevance for all of us: "Film festivals in rural areas". Moreover, we have established lines of collaboration with different interests groups in the territory as an ideal way to implement the sustainable development goals.

As a new feature of this edition, we are inaugurating the Award for the Best Film of the Official Competition, awarded by an Official Jury made up of film professionals, in addition to the already established Audience Award.

With these new features and commemorations we renew our commitment with the marine environment, the fishing sector and with local people, to continue to be a place of reference and a meeting point.

Synopsis:

Glaciers show us undeniable evidence that climate change is happening and that humans are transforming the Earth's systems. Glaciers reflect our past and reveal our future. Combining historical and present-day aerial views of six glaciers from the Hornafjörður region, in the southeast of Iceland, this documentary exposes a rapidly disappearing ice world. If the climate crises seems an invisible threat in other parts of the world, here it is written in the landscape. These glaciers show how what happens to the ice also happens to us.

This interlude is an intense and at the same time delicate space of time, like the choral interlude of an ancient tragedy made of gestures and movements that oscillate between closeness and distance, between union and detachment, between tension and tenderness.



Driven by the wind in the sails and the waves on the shore, Kélou is viscerally linked to the ocean. He has built his life by listening to the elements of nature and multiplying his activities to enjoy the pleasures that the sea offers him in the different seasons. However, in order to be able to live on the coast, he decided to work as a fisherman. This is how he discovered this mysterious world, which shaped his region, in the south-west of Brittany. Whereas, in the past, being born by the sea was an extension of wealth to be conquered, today the ocean is a choice, a conviction.

The work is easier, but its fate is uncertain. Through their voices and stories, images of the past and photographs of the present, the last fishermen reveal their intimate secrets that, in the future, perhaps no one will ever keep again.

Shrimps go on their way, seagulls presage death,.... What will humans do?

Although the oceans make up 70% of the Earth's surface, so far only a very small part of the seabed has been mapped. However, in recent years, the interest in mapping these spaces has accelerated due to different economic, geopolitical and scientific interests, determined to build a "new continent" to be exploited/explored under the sea. This video essay takes the ocean floor and its cartography as its thematic axis to talk about colonialism, ecology and representation.

Mayotte is the island of children: half the population is under 18. However, it is far from being a paradise. Faced with poverty, illegal immigration and crime, the children feel abandoned in this land of translucent waters... Some of them have decided to take their destiny into their own hands and make the ocean their best ally, despite prejudice, local beliefs and their difficult and sometimes dangerous daily lives. They dream of becoming divers, explorers, cooks or fishermen. The sea is their hope, their lifeline.

A new collective consciousness that emerges in them, thus intuiting that they not only carry out artisan work, but that they are a network of affection that transforms the world they inhabit.

We accompany three young boatbuilders and their masters, who work at three different locations along the Norwegian coast. There are not many traditional boat builders left. Those who possess this knowledge treasure a living cultural heritage dating back to Viking times.

In March 2020, a closure was imposed on all fishing activities in Kollam, in the state of Kerale, in the South of India. Shot during the height of the first wave of COVID-19, this documentary tells the story of how Kollam fishermen faced confinement and disruption to their work. The local cooperative introduced a major change in the auction system, aimed at ensuring the security of the fishing community and redressing the imbalance of power between fishermen and traders. However, the new system had some unexpected consequences.

The relationship between the sea and humans has always had two faces. On 17th June 2021, the seiner 'Siempre Güeto' sank in the waters of Cedeira, in the north of Galicia. Unfortunately, sinkings are common in Galicia, but no one can ever get used to losing someone at sea or to the proximity of death.



This is the story of a group of people – photographers, marine biologists, whale rescuers and fishermen – united to save the right whale.

Synopsis:

Considered as one of the first feature-length documentaries in history, it aims to depict the daily life of the family of the Inuit Nanook ("Polar Bear"), as well as the harshness of living conditions in the frozen region of Nunavik, in the North of Canada. A nomadic life that depends on the skills of foraging and shelter building. However, many of the scenes are the result of representation and exoticisation. One hundred years after its release, the film continues to cause controversy for its depiction of the indigenous peoples of the region.

Documentary filmed entirely in Super-8 that, beyond the technical challenge, aims to be a wake-up call about the harmful consequences of climate change and global warming, through the adventures that the director experiences on board the icebreaker Malmö, such as following a bear and her cubs or recovering a camera accidentally submerged 140 metres below the surface. The work depicts the real threat caused by uncontrolled human activity, which leads to the melting of the Arctic.

Round table organised in collaboration with Proxecta. Coordinadora Galega de Festivais de Cinema, in which various professionals from the sector will discuss the reality of programming film festivals in rural Galicia. Moderated by Elena Mareque (Proxecta), it will include the participation of Ángel Sánchez (co-director of Play-Doc), Xisela Franco (filmmaker and festival curator), Manuel Pena (director of FICBUEU) and Jesús Silva (programmer at MDFDM and film critic).



Representatives of the Agrupación de Mariscadoras a pé da Confraría San Bartolomé de Noia will give a demonstration of the shellfish extraction process on Siavo beach. Afterwards, at O Freixo fish market, participants will be able to see how the product is classified and weighed.



Round table with the participation of several experts and professionals from the fishing and scientific sectors, in which they will discuss the perception that society has of the world of fishing, as well as its repercussions in the political and environmental fields. Moderated by **Javier G. Galdo**, it will bring together **Basilio Otero** (president of the FNCP), **Carmen Alonso** (skipper and fisherwoman on the "Carmín", Asturias), **Emilio Louro** (Marketing and Distribution of Artisanal Fishing Online) and **Eva Velasco** (scientist and researcher at IEO/DIVERSIMAR).



Gastronomic tasting session by the **Asociación de Hostalaría Ría da Estrela**. Formed by a group of hotel and restaurant owners from the Ría de Muros e Noia, it is currently made up of around 30 members, representatives of the tourist industry which is the fabric of the area. The dishes will be prepared with typical local products.



This tour is designed to raise awareness of and spread knowledge about the historical importance of the riverside carpentry in Outes, which will culminate in a guided visit to the Estaleiro Ciprián — Espazo Museístico da Carpintaría de Ribeira de Outes. Explanations by Antonio Rodríguez (Tremuzo) and Ignacio Fernández (Tourism Technician of Outes Town Council).



The historic sailing ship Joaquín Vieta — Balandro, built in 1916 in the Ríos shipyard (O Freixo), began its activity as a goods transport vessel in 1917. From the 1960s until the beginning of the 21st century, it acted as an auxiliary boat. It was at the beginning of this century when the Balandro Joaquín Vieta Association saved it from scrapping and decided to rebuild it.

During the Mostra, the sailboat will leave the port of O Freixo together with several traditional boats of the **Terra de Outes Association**, skirting the coastline of the Ría de Muros e Noia.



The Mobile Phone Cinema Workshop that the Mostra MDFDM has been developing since its first edition, is reinforced this year with the participation of students in two training and educational activities that had the collaboration of the City Council of Outes, GALP Costa Sostible, IES Poeta Añón, ECONOIA 3 Project of the Plan Mar Limpo of the Ministry of the Sea, the group of shellfish fisherwomen from the fishing guild San Bartolomé de Noia and the cultural association "Terra de Outes."

In these training activities for new audiences, the students came into contact with cinematography and with the narrative treatment of their heritage, social and environmental surroundings. During the closing ceremony of the V Mostra MDFDM, the work developed will be screened and diplomas will be awarded to the students.
